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**MORENCI ELEMENTARY ANNUAL EDUCATION REPORT (AER)
COVER LETTER**

March 8, 2017

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2015-16 educational progress for the Morenci Elementary. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. If you have any questions about the AER, please contact Gail Frey for assistance.

The AER is available for you to review electronically by visiting the following web site www.morencibulldogs.org, or you may review a copy in the main office at your child's school.

For the 2016-17 year, no new Priority or Focus schools were named; some Priority or Focus schools did exit their status because they met the exit criteria. New Reward schools were identified using school rankings and Beating the Odds information. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap between the highest and lowest achieving 30% of schools. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Reward school is one that has achieved one or more of the following distinctions: top 5% of schools on the Top-to-Bottom School Rankings, top 5% of schools making the greatest gains in achievement (improvement metric), or "Beating the Odds" by outperforming the school's predicted ranking and/or similar schools. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases no label is given.

Our school has not been given a label.

Morenci Elementary had identified key challenges through the comprehensive needs assessment. Morenci has a large population of free and reduced lunch students indicating a large percentage of economically disadvantaged students. When looking at our data this is our lowest performing group in all subject areas. The district hired an elementary reading specialist to address this concern. After school tutoring is provided, free of charge, for our lowest performing students. While we continue to see gains for these students, there is much work to be done. We have incorporated blending learning, and technology based instruction to help differentiate instruction for all students.

PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Morenci Elementary welcomes new students. You may register at the elementary office during regular school hours. School of Choice applications are also available at the office. During the summer months, registration is ongoing at the elementary building. Parents may also call central office at 1-517-458-7501 for further information.

STATUS SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

The Elementary school improvement team meets monthly to assess data and continually improve the plan to meet the every changing needs of our young learners. Parents are invited to join this team and should call the elementary office to indicate their interest.

2015-2016 SPECIALIZED SCHOOLS ANNUAL REPORT

The students of Morenci Area Schools receive special education services through the Lenawee Intermediate School District (LISD). In addition to the specialized schools, students receive diagnostic testing, school psychology, school social work, physical and occupational therapy, career technical education, special needs training and speech pathology services.

The Lenawee Intermediate School District provides educational service to students from birth through age 26 who have severe handicaps. Students with severe physical, mental, emotional or sensory impairments may receive their educational program at a classroom operated by the LISD. Students from Morenci Elementary attended LISD classroom programs during the 2015-16 school year.

The LISD operates the Laura Haviland Program for elementary, middle and high school students with severe emotional and behavioral impairments

In cooperation with the Lenawee County Probate Court, the LISD operates the juvenile education program housed at the Maurice Spear Campus.

LISD operates special education classrooms in local districts including classrooms for students with physical or other health impairments and hearing impairments in

Madison; and classrooms for students with cognitive impairments in Tecumseh and Adrian.

The LISD PREP Academy provides educational programs for teen parents from Lenawee County. During the student's instructional program, childcare support is provided.

The LISD TECH Center offers career technical education programs for high school juniors and seniors. 55 students from Morenci Area Schools attended the LISD TECH Center or participated in the co-op/work experience program during 2015-16. This equals 56% of the junior and senior population for this school district.

The most recent follow-up of LISD TECH Center students (a 2015 study of 2014 graduates) showed 71.1% were continuing their education. Of those continuing their education, 71.3% were continuing in a field related to their LISD TECH Center program. In addition, 89.4% were working (full-time or part-time) with 7.6% reporting they were seeking employment. Of those working full-time, 71.4% were in a field related to their LISD TECH Center program.

Local districts operate special education classrooms open to students from other districts. Morenci Area Schools placed students with Addison Public Schools Level II classroom, and Adrian Elementary Level II classroom during the 2015-16 school year.

CORE CURRICULUM

In 2015-2016 the elementary school used the Essential Skills Inventory (Sornson, Early Learning Foundation) to monitor progress of students based on the use of The Common Core Standards, and Grade Level Expectations. Work continues on differentiating instruction to meet the ever changing learning styles and needs of students. Professional development focuses on blended learning and formative assessment.

The campus of Morenci Elementary school is neatly settled south of the Middle/High School building. Our building features an updated computer lab with 56 computers, 11 regular education classrooms, 2 Great Start Classrooms, One Head Start Classroom, and a beautiful library with up to date furnishings. All students K-4 are provided 1:1 I-pads to enhance technology integration into their education.

The elementary is proud of their dedicated teaching and support staff. Our students participate in Science Olympiad, Safety Patrol, COSI Science Lab, After School Tutoring, a Thanksgiving Turkey Trot to provide food for the local food pantry, and Jump Rope for Heart.

We are fortunate to have an active Parent Teacher Organization (PTO) and a community who rallies around our students by providing school supplies, attending reading night activities, and participating in many of our year round family events.
